Family and MWR offers competitive salaries and benefit packages that include medical, dental and life insurance. Comprehensive retirement and 401(k) plans are available and the organization will match your monthly contributions up to four percent. There are also multiple ways to move upward in Family and MWR through training opportunities and developmental assignments.

WHAT IS NAF EMPLOYMENT?

NAF (Non - Appropriate Fund) employment is considered federal employment. It is, however, different from federal civil service employment because the monies used to pay the salaries of NAF employees come from a different source. Civil service positions are paid for by money appropriated by Congress. NAF money, on the other hand, is self-generated by Army clubs, bowling centers, golf courses, and other activities that use NAF employees.

We have two types of NAF positions: "flexible" and "regular". Flexible employees have work schedules that depend on the needs of the activity. These employees may work a minimum of zero hours to a maximum of 40 hours per week, and do not receive benefits. Regular employees work between 20 and 40 hours a week depending on position requirements, and are entitled to receive benefits. All federal job openings (NAF and otherwise) are posted online at USAJOBS.gov. USAJobs.gov offers a one-stop shop for all your government job hunting. 



FAP is dedicated to the prevention of intimate partner and child abuse and neglect. The focus is on prevention and education that helps Soldiers and Families recognize and meet the unique challenges of military lifestyles. FAP provides a wide range of services designed to promote positive family relationships. Services include crisis intervention, stress and anger management classes, marriage/couple communication workshops, parent education, New Parent Support Program (NPSP), home visitation and parent/child playgroups, family life skills workshops and child abuse prevention classes. FAP offers support and education to the community in relation to Problematic Sexual Behavior in Children and Youth. FAP offers trainings to educate command personnel and military community to recognize signs of possible child abuse and domestic abuse. Emphasis is on prevention, education and prompt reporting. The Victim Advocacy Program provides comprehensive services to victims of domestic abuse by trained professionals who provide non-clinical advocacy services and support to Soldiers and Family members experiencing domestic abuse. Victim advocates are on-call 24 hours a day/7 days a week to provide crisis intervention, safety planning, non-judgmental support, assistance in securing medical treatment for injuries, information on legal rights and proceedings, and referrals to military and civilian resources. The NPSP operates out of building 8946 on 7th Avenue, conveniently located near a housing area and the Child Development Center.


Provides Soldiers and Family members with current beneficial financial information, education, and individual financial counseling to ensure they are better able to make informed and knowledgeable financial decisions. The FRP has an assortment of services to assist individuals improve their financial well-being, financial self-sufficiency, and reduce financial stressors. Emphasis is on presentations designed to inform individuals regarding money management, debt management, saving and investing to include the Thrift Savings Plan (TSP) and home buying fundamentals. Mandatory counseling for the Financial Readiness Common Military Training Milestones (PCS, Promotion, TSP, Blended Retirement Continuation Pay, Birth or Adoption, Marriage, Divorce and Pre/Post-Deployment) is offered. The FRP also provides information and support concerning consumer awareness, consumer advocacy, and emergency financial assistance. Financial planning can ease the stress of PCSing and it is as simple as calling to meet with an accredited financial counselor.

Intake evaluations are conducted to link the Fort Rucker community with available and appropriate resources without duplication of effort. Army Community Service is your one-stop location for information on installation and community resources. Relocation Readiness provides information and assistance to military personnel and their Families as they transition from one community to another. Soldiers and/or their dependents may request information about their new assignment by visiting or calling the office. Overseas briefs are held to prepare Soldiers and Family members moving to Germany, Korea, Alaska, and Hawaii. Individual relocation counseling is targeted to Soldiers and Families preparing for their first permanent change of duty station or a first overseas Permanent Change of Station. A Relocation Readiness Workshop is offered on demand only for Soldiers and their Families. Information on Army benefits, entitlements, TLE, BAH, per diem and TDY, as well as budgeting and spousal employment are discussed at the workshop. The monthly Newcomers' Welcome is required for newly arrived Soldiers and is open to all ID cardholders and provides information about Fort Rucker and the surrounding communities. If you're new or have been in the community for a while we would like to invite you to our monthly Coffee and Friends group. Relocation readiness also provides Sponsorship Training for military and civilian personnel.

The Survivor Outreach Services (SOS) Program demonstrates the Army's commitment to Families of the Fallen. Survivors are the loved ones of Fallen Service Members, to include parents, spouses, children and siblings. Support is provided to Survivors from all branches of service and all components, Active, Reserve and National Guard. The program is a holistic, multi-agency approach embracing and reassuring Survivors they are continually linked to the Military Family for as long as they desire. Confidential services are provided based on specific individualized needs. Survivors receive support, advocacy, and assistance via group activities providing peer networking opportunities, benefits and financial counseling/planning, and referral services for military and community resources. Gold Star Families parking has been designated at various locations on Fort Rucker, in honor and recognition of the sacrifices of Family members who have lost a loved one in military service. Survivors are reminded that it is important to keep their support coordinator updated on any changes to contact information to include relocating to a new address so that they can remain connected to the program for as long as they desire.

EQUIPMENT CHECKOUT CENTER

For that special family outing, Outdoor Recreation (ODR) offers several items to aide in the fun and enjoyment for your entire family. Pontoon boats, ski/wake board boats, fishing boats, water tubes, jet skis, canoes, kayaks, and paddle boards are available for use at Lake Tholocco. For those family reunions or school fund raisers, ODR offers picnic pavilions, inflatables, horseshoe sets, BBQ cookers, canopies and dunking booths. For camping enthusiasts, ODR has travel trailers.

Outdoor Recreation oversees picnic areas at Lake Tholocco (West & East Beach), Beaver Lake, and Buckhorn Lake. Patrons will need to reserve pavilion areas through Outdoor Recreation.



Picnic areas are authorized for use on a first come, first served basis, unless reserved through the Outdoor Recreation Pro Shop. Reservations are confirmed only after receipt of appropriate fees, and are subject to cancellation restrictions. Units/Organizations must submit a request in writing for organizational days at least 5 business days in advance.

Equipment Checkout is available to authorized patrons. Fulltime government contractors and personnel with a valid ID badge are also authorized to checkout equipment from Outdoor Recreation Equipment Rental, but may not sponsor a guest.

FISHING AND HUNTING

Fort Rucker has several excellent lakes and ponds for fishing: Lake Tholocco, Beaver Lake, Buckhorn Lake, Ech Lake, Beaver Pond, and Parcours Lake (for the youths under the age of 16). Come try your luck with largemouth bass, hybrid bass, catfish, crappie and bream.

Fort Rucker also offers deer, turkey and hog hunting. All hunters 16 years of age and above must complete and be in possession of the valid hunter's education card. If you do not have a hunter's education card, the Alabama State Hunter Education program offers hunter education classes at various locations or complete the entire course online at outdooralabama.com. All individuals 16 years and older are required to have an Alabama State license and a Fort Rucker post permit. The Alabama State license may be purchased at the Outdoor Recreation Service Center. Military personnel without an Alabama driver license will need to present a copy of orders indicating Fort Rucker as their current duty station. Military dependents without an Alabama driver license will need to present orders authorizing movement of dependents to Fort Rucker. DID YOU KNOW?

FORT RUCKER HISTORY

A BRIEF HISTORY OF FORT RUCKER

Although both Fort Rucker and Army Aviation trace their origins back to earlier eras, they came into being during the early months of World War II. The United States entered the war on December 8, 1941, following the surprise Japanese attack on Hawaii, the Philippines, Guam, and Midway. On December 15, Congress voted an appropriation of \$10 billion for the defense of the United States and established a military service draft for men from 20 to 44 years of age during World War II. America conducted a manpower mobilization unprecedented in its history in terms of total numbers; the United States put into uniform more than 16 million men (one-sixth of the total male population) and also approximately 333,000 women. This mobilization called for the creation of new training camps and military bases, including Camp Rucker.

CAMP RUCKER

The original name of the post was Ozark Triangular Division Camp, but before the camp was officially opened on May 1, 1942, the War Department named it Camp Rucker. The post was named in honor of Colonel Edmund W. Rucker, a Civil War Confederate officer, who was given the honorary title of "General," and who became an industrial leader in Birmingham after the war. In September 1942, 1,259 additional acres south of Daleville were acquired for the construction of an airfield to support the training camp. It was known as Ozark Army Airfield until January 1959, when the name was changed to Cairns Army Airfield. The first troops to train at Camp Rucker were those of the 81st (Wildcat) Infantry Division; the 81st Division left Rucker for action in the Pacific Theater in March 1943. During the latter part of World War II, several hundred German and a few Italian prisoners-of-war were housed in stockades near the railroad east of the warehouse area, on the southern edge of the post. The Camp became a Fort on February 1, 1955, and the Army Aviation Center was officially established at Rucker. In October of that year, the post was given permanent status with the name change from Camp Rucker to Fort Rucker.



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BENEFITING LOCAL WOUNDED WARRIORS WOUNDED WARRIOR PROGRAM RECREATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES

Fort Rucker Outdoor Recreation provides Wounded Warriors and Wounded Veterans specialized recreation equipment. Among the items funded with the proceeds from the Wounded Warrior Hunts and local Sponsors are a 42 ft wheelchair accessible travel trailer complete with a hydraulic lift, accessible mobile tracked wheelchair which allows a hunter to go over various outdoor terrains, and two hydraulic hunting stands which can be moved to desired hunting locations. The 5x7 ft hunting stands sit on a trailer with controls that allow them to be lowered to the ground (so no ramps needed) and elevated to any height up to 18 ft providing a better field of view for hunting. This equipment makes hunting more accessible for hunters with physical limitations.

A specially designed and customized Rhino Boat named "The Warrior" has been completely customized to fit the needs of a person with disabilities and allow them to operate the boat or to be a passenger. Customized features on the boat include a ramp allowing a wheel chair to roll directly onto the boat, specialized controls, remote control automated anchor, wheel chair locking system, and specialized safety features.

WOUNDED WARRIOR RETREAT BY THE LAKE
Wounded Warrior Retreat by the Lake is a three bedroom, two bathroom, ADA accessible cabin donated by the Wiregrass Wounded Veterans Committee (WWVC). These amenities make the great outdoors more accessible for Wounded Warriors and Wounded Veterans with physical limitations. Authorized Patrons, priority reservations, and fee information can be found online at rucker.armymwr.com. Fort Rucker Family & MWR provides Soldiers, Civilians and their Families with a quality of life commensurate with the quality of their service. Patrons can coordinate with the Fort Rucker Outdoor Recreation department for assistance with using the equipment. FORT RUCKER A FISHERMAN'S PARADISE

LAKE THOLOCCO

This 676.8 acre lake is located on Johnston Road and is home to our Outdoor Recreation Service Center, West Beach swimming area, RV Park and Lake Tholocco Lodging cabins. While this location is known for its amazing views and recreation on the shore, its waters offer a fisherman's paradise 24 hours a day 7 days a week. Lake Tholocco fishing is open to all ages.

BEAVER LAKE

Surrounded by walking trails, this 7.7 acre lake is open to all ages, from sunup to sundown. Access to Beaver Lake can be found off of 3rd Avenue, by the Fort Rucker Physical Fitness Center's football field.

BEAVER POND

This small fishing pond is open to all ages, from sunup to sundown. Beaver Pond is located off of Andrews Avenue, between Silver Wings Golf Club and the Ozark Gate.

PARCOURS LAKE

At 4.1 acres, this lake is reserved for youth, ages 15 and below. Ages 16 and above may assist youth in fishing, but may not actively fish at this lake. Ages 13 and under must be a companion by an adult. Parcoures Lake is located on Farrel Road, behind Lyster Army Health Clinic.

ECH LAKE

This 7.7 acre lake is open to all ages, from sunup to sundown, however, days of operation are subject to change. To get to Ech Lake, turn from Christian Road onto Johnston Road, then take the first unpaved road on the left and follow the signs to Ech Lake.

BUCKHORN LAKE

This 13.2-acre lake is open to all ages. Buckhorn Lake is open from sunup to sundown, however days of operation are subject to change. The Lake is located 2 miles past Silver Wings Golf Club on Hatch Road.



FORT RUCKER ADOPT-A-TRAIL PROGRAM

Have you made use of the extensive network of walking and biking trails on Fort Rucker? If so, consider becoming a volunteer in our new Adopt-a-Trail program!

Adopt-a-Trail volunteers promote community stewardship and bridge the communication between the community and MWR. The Adopt-a-Trail program sends a message that the community cares about its trails. Through monthly visits to your trail, volunteers document maintenance needs, report acts of vandalism, interact with trail users, promote trail safety, and encourage an overall positive use of public trails.

Volunteers have two trails to choose from: the Parcours trail is a walking/running nature trail with 18 fitness stations. This course is relatively flat and easily traversed: the mountain biking trails are rugged nature trails consisting of uneven terrain with hills and dips. Volunteers can indicate which type of trail they prefer to work on, as well as the length of trail under their care.

OUTDOOR RECREATION HUNTING & FISHING REGULATIONS

ALABAMA STATE HUNTING/FISHING LICENSE & FORT RUCKER POST PERMIT

Hunting and Fishing on Fort Rucker requires that individuals ages 16 and older have an Alabama State License and a Fort Rucker Post Permit. The Alabama State license may be purchased at the Outdoor Recreation Service Center.



To purchase an Alabama State License at the Alabama state resident price, military personnel and their dependents stationed at Fort Rucker are required to provide a copy of orders of assignment to Alabama, along with their military identification card, driver's license, and hunter safety education card. Without an Alabama driver license or copy of orders of assignment to Alabama, patron will be subjected to non-resident prices. Alabama residents over the age of 65 are not required to have an Alabama State License, but must have a Fort Rucker Post Permit. Youth ages 15 and younger do not need a State License or a Post Permit. State Fishing and Hunting Licenses and Post Permits expire on August 31 and must be renewed annually.

HISTORY OF THE BEAR

In many cities across America, mascots can be found that promote esprit de corps –Enterprise has the Boll Weevil, Dothan has its Peanut statues and Louisville has its Horses – and promoting morale is one of the things that Fort Rucker's Sgt. Ted E. Bear does best.

Located at the corner of Andrews and Novosel, Sgt. Ted E. Bear has watched over Fort Rucker for the last 61 years. Standing watch over the installation just inside the Daleville gate across from the Army Aviation Museum, he observes the thousands of people passing by him every day.

Lee Koplín originally designed him in Panama City; Sgt. Ted E. Bear was assembled here on Fort Rucker and has been an icon on Fort Rucker ever since.

Over the years, Sgt. Ted E. Bear has donned many outfits as part of his provided care, ranging from bunny and penguin suits to flight suits even a Santa outfit for Christmas. He has also sported superhero costumes and a variety of other seasonable ensembles.

Sgt. Ted E. Bear overshadows all of his fellow sergeants, if not by age then by dimensions. At 15 feet high, he weighs over 2,000 pounds (mostly made of solid concrete), with his weight steadily growing with each outfit he dons.

Sgt. Ted E. Bear was originally erected as an emblem of the 2nd Battle Group, 31st Infantry Regiment, also known as the Polar Bear Regiment. Construction was commissioned in 1961, by Col. Bennett L. Jackson, to commemorate the action the unit saw while attempting to keep the Trans-Siberian Railroad open during World War I, in Murmansk, Russia. It was that operation that earned the regiment the nickname "The Polar Bears"

Sgt. Ted E. Bear was originally located next to the 46th Engineer Battalion building after the 31st Infantry Regiment was reassigned to Fort Benning, Georgia, in 1966.

Eventually, the responsibility of caring for Sgt. Ted E. Bear passed to 1st Battalion, 210th Aviation Regiment, in 1994, when the bulk of the engineer battalion relocated to Fort Polk, La., and he was then reassigned to the Warrant Officer Career College, in 1997.

With his reassignment to the 210th, he received his new orders, rank and name -- Pfc. Ted E. Bear. He was promoted to sergeant Sept. 19, 2007, in an official ceremony approved by Maj. Gen. Virgil L. Packett II, then U.S. Army Aviation Warfighting Center and Fort Rucker Commanding General.

In 2008, Sgt. Ted E. Bear was moved from his original home on Ruf Avenue to his new home near the U.S. Army Aviation Museum, where he bravely and quietly stands guard. Currently Sgt. Ted E. Bear is assigned to the MWR Marketing team, who take great pride and care when it comes to his wellbeing.

Generations of Aviators, Veterans, Retirees and Civilians have visited Fort Rucker over the years and expect to see him when they come through. "It is always nice to see him in a new outfit promoting the community and supporting the Soldiers for us." "If he was not there as I drove in each morning it just wouldn't be the same," said MWR Marketing Manager Chris Mendez.

Truly, Sgt. Ted E. Bear serves as a colorful community bulletin board, and many organizations have upped the ante when it comes to decorating him -- giving him 3D accessories like banners, hats, sporting equipment and large polar bear sized packages.

People can only wonder what fashion statements Sgt. Ted E. Bear will reveal next and when he will be promoted to staff sergeant, because he is surely the most famous sergeant in the lower 49 states.

Sgt. Ted E. Bear is part of the tradition of being at Fort Rucker, even though his origins do not lie in aviation. He is part of the experience of becoming an Army aviator.

Fort Rucker's Better Opportunities for Single Soldiers (BOSS) is a program that supports the overall quality of life (QOL) for single and unaccompanied Soldiers. BOSS also participates in diverse recreational events. As a result of the single Soldiers dedication to the program, Fort Rucker BOSS has been recognized by IMCOM as having one of the premier programs in the Army.

The renovated BOSS building is a place where single and unaccompanied Soldiers can relax and have some fun while playing video games or pool, or watching a movie in the theater room. Free Wi-Fi Internet is also available in the BOSS building. BOSS building hours are posted on the front of the facility. Council and Event Planning Meetings are open to all Soldiers and organizations that would like to participate in BOSS. The Fort Rucker Physical Fitness Center (PFC) is a sixty-four thousand square foot facility offering a variety of cardiovascular equipment ranging from treadmills to Concept2 rowers; LifeFitness selectorized equipment; and a free-weight and dumbbell area with Hammer Strength Equipment. This facility offers a fully equipped functional fitness area with a rig and artificial turf.

Patrons are encouraged to stop by the customer service desk to sign out a variety of auxiliary equipment such as jump ropes, racquetball equipment, belts and more. Group Fitness classes are offered as well and schedules can be picked up at the front desk or found at rucker.armymwr.com. This facility is equipped with one racquetball court, two additional functional fitness rooms, a 25-meter indoor pool, outdoor multi-purpose fields, a quarter-mile track, 18 - hole disc golf course, batting cages and a mountain bike trail.

The PFC maintains five running/walking trails around Fort Rucker and can provide runners with a map and trail descriptions. Patrons have access to men's and women's locker rooms with all the normal amenities, including sauna and steam room as well as daily use lockers. The PFC organizes and hosts a variety of fitness programs and events including personal training services, intramural sports, competitive and non-competitive running events, health-promotion events, Rucker Runs Program, Gym Rat Program, and other activities.



WARRIOR ADVENTURE QUEST MOUNTAIN BIKING TRAILS

The Warrior Adventure Quest Mountain Biking Trails span a large area between Farrell Road and Lyster, and past headquarters and the PX. The trails intertwine with the Parcours Fitness trail and have a designated bike route of approximately 3.5 miles, indicated by white arrows on trees. A yellow-red-green safety system is in place with yellow being moderately difficult, red being extremely difficult and green being "all clear". Please stop by the PFC on Andrews Avenue or the marquees along the trail heads for all rules associated with the trails. A mountain bike issue program is also available through the Fort Rucker PFC on Andrews Avenue.

SWIMMING & AQUATICS

The Fort Rucker Physical Fitness Center features an eight lane, heated, twenty five meter indoor pool with a low dive, and handicap access. Lifeguard certification courses, swim lessons, water aerobics, and military training are offered.

Fort Rucker offers two different walking/running trail systems, one located near Parcours Lake and one surrounding Beaver Lake. Each trail offers a customizable experience for runners of any fitness level. The running trails behind Parcours Lake intertwine with bike trails. Different stations are available throughout the trail system such as balance beams, pull-up bars and monkey bars. The Parcours Lake trails contain more than a dozen stations for different workouts and could be ideal for anyone who wishes to incorporate more into their workout. The Beaver Lake trail splits into four unique routes two-thirds of the way into the path. Maps are available at the PFC.

HELPFUL INFO FROM THE SUPPORT SERVICES DIVISION

The Post Solicitation Office is responsible for the oversight of business conducted on the Fort Rucker installation, private organizations, and the coordination of on-post fundraising. Solicitation permits may be issued for individuals conducting business on-post including, but not limited to, Insurance Agents, Financial Representatives, Photographers, Domestic Cleaning Companies, and Home Based Businesses such as Pampered Chef, Mary Kay, and Scentsy.

Please be aware of the following with regards to solicitation on the installation:

- A permit (Fort Rucker Form 44) must be issued to conduct business on the installation.
- The permit does not allow door-to-door solicitation.
- All business must be conducted by appointment only and appointments must not be during duty hours.
- Solicitation may not be conducted in mass, group, or captive audiences.
- Agents may not distribute literature on the installation, except to the person that they have a scheduled appointment with. This includes the distribution of flyers and business cards unless specifically requested by a client from the sales representative.

- Agents may contact prospective clients initially by methods such as advertising, direct mail, and telephone.
- Commercial insurance agents are not authorized to give financial planning briefings during military sponsored events.
- Agents are prohibited from having allotment forms in their possession and/or assist in the administrative processing of these forms.
- Personnel in pay grades E1, E2, and E3 are required to be counseled by the commander or designated individual using DA Form 2056, Commercial Insurance Solicitation Record, prior to purchasing insurance. These Soldiers are required to wait seven days from initial counseling before an allotment form is signed and submitted to finance for processing.
- Commanders should have designated areas assigned for agents to meet with Soldiers who live in the barracks. Agents are not authorized in individual rooms.
- Home address of members of the command or unit will not be given to commercial enterprises, or individual agents.
- DoD personnel will not act in any official or business capacity, either directly or indirectly, as liaison with agents to arrange appointments.
- The Department of the Army does not endorse any company or products offered on the installation.



AUTHORIZED PATRONS

Authorized Patronage of Fort Rucker Morale, Welfare, and Recreation (MWR) Activities

Active duty and retired military personnel, Active Duty Coast Guard and their Family Members with valid ID cards are authorized use of all MWR facilities on a priority basis, in accordance with individual facility age requirements. The following MWR patronage policy for DoD Appropriated Fund (APF), Nonappropriated Fund (NAF) and Coast Guard civilians, Reserve Components, contract civilians, and their Family Members (who meet individual facility age requirements) and their guests is established at Fort Rucker, Alabama. Participation in, or spectators at, music and theater productions, sporting events, special events and other activities open to the local community to foster public relations, when their participation is an enhancement, are authorized. Patronage privileges will be suspended, terminated, or denied if the installation commander or his delegate determines it to be in the best interest of the activity, program, installation or Army.

PROGRAM SPECIFIC - AUTHORIZED PATRON ELIGIBILITY:

BINGO: All participants must be over the age of 18 to purchase cards or claim prizes. All members of the United States Reserve Components and their Family Members with a valid ID card are authorized. Currently employed and retired APF, NAF, and DoD and Coast Guard civilians are authorized. DoD contract employees working full time on the installation are authorized. Bona fide guests of authorized patrons. Bingo callers or monitors, Family & MWR managers, the DFMWR, direct line supervisors, other employees of the sponsoring activity, and their immediate Family Members may not play. Employees assigned to one or more MWR activity (ies) may participate in bingo sponsored by an unrelated activity if they are otherwise eligible. Former Prisoners of War (POWs), and spouses of current POWs or Service members missing in action (MIA) and their Family Members are authorized. Non-DoD Federal employees working on the installation are authorized. Community area residents with no military affiliation may participate in FB&E activities. Participation will be IAW FB&E operational procedures for nonmilitary patrons, and on a space availability basis.

BOWLING CENTER: All members of the United States Reserve Components and their Family Members with a valid ID card are authorized. Currently employed and retired APF, NAF, and DoD and Coast Guard civilians are authorized. DoD contract employees working full time on the installation are authorized. Community area residents with no military affiliation may participate in bowling activities. Participation will be IAW bowling operational procedures for nonmilitary patrons, and on a space availability basis. Former Prisoners of War (POWs), and spouses of current POWs or Service members missing in action (MIA) and their Family Members are authorized. Non-DoD Federal employees working on the installation are authorized.

CHILD & YOUTH SERVICES (CYS): Authorized Patrons include: All members of the United States Reserve Components and their Family Members with a valid ID card; currently employed and retired APF, NAF, and DoD and Coast Guard civilians; DoD contract employees working full time on the installation; former Prisoners of War (POWs), and spouses of current POWs or Service members missing in action (MIA) and their Family Members; non-DoD Federal employees working on the installation.

FOOD, BEVERAGE AND ENTERTAINMENT (FB&E): Authorized Patrons include: All members of the United States Reserve Components and their Family Members with a valid ID card are authorized. Currently employed and retired APF, NAF, and DoD and Coast Guard civilians are authorized. DoD contract employees working full time on the installation are authorized. Community area residents with no military affiliation may participate in FB&E activities. Participation will be IAW FB&E operational procedures for nonmilitary patrons, and on a space availability basis. Former Prisoners of War (POWs), and spouses of current POWs or Service members missing in action (MIA) and their Family Members are authorized. Non-DoD Federal employees working on the installation are authorized.

GOLF COURSE: All members of the United States Reserve Components and their Family Members with a valid ID card are authorized. Currently employed and retired APF, NAF, and DoD and Coast Guard civilians are authorized. DoD contract employees working full time on the installation are authorized. Community area residents with no military affiliation may participate in Golf Course activities. Participation will be IAW Silver Wings Golf Club operational procedures for nonmilitary patrons, and on a space availability basis. Former Prisoners of War (POWs), and spouses of current POWs or Service members missing in action (MIA) and their Family Members are authorized. Non-DoD Federal employees working on the installation are authorized.

INTRAMURAL SPORTS PROGRAM: Authorized Patrons include: All members of the United States Reserve Components and their Family members with a valid ID card, who meet age restrictions; currently employed and retired APF, NAF, and DoD and Coast Guard civilians and eligible Family Members residing in the sponsor's household, as outlined in Memorandum of Instruction for each sport, may take part in military intramural sports programs; Family Members of active duty military personnel, with a valid ID card, may participate in intramural sports programs when age requirements are met and specific intramural sports leagues will allow participation; contract civilians are authorized to participate in accordance with the Memorandum of Instruction (MOI) for each intramural program; spectators at sporting events and invited community civilian teams are authorized to observe and participate in scheduled tournaments and sport events; former Prisoners of War (POWs), and spouses of current POWs or Service members missing in action (MIA) and their Family Members are authorized; non-DoD Federal employees working on the installation are authorized to participate in accordance with the Memorandum of Instruction (MOI) for each intramural program. Civilian personnel and Family Members may not participate with military personnel in individual sports or contact sports (boxing, wrestling, team handball, and football).

LAKE THOLOCCO LODGING: All members of the United States Reserve Components and their Family Members with a valid ID card are authorized. Currently employed and retired APF, NAF, and retired DoD and Coast Guard civilians are authorized. DoD contract employees working full time on the installation are authorized. Former Prisoners of War (POWs), and spouses of current POWs or Service members missing in action (MIA) and their Family Members are authorized. Non-DoD Federal employees working on the installation are authorized. Guests when accompanied by an authorized patron.

LIBRARY: Authorized Patrons include: All members of the United States Reserve Components and their Family Members with a valid ID card; currently employed and retired APF, NAF, and DoD and Coast Guard civilians; DoD contractor employees working full time on the installation; non-DoD Federal employees working on the installation; guests, when accompanied by authorized patrons, are authorized in-house use of materials; former Prisoners of War (POWs), and spouses of current POWs or Service members missing in action (MIA) and their Family Members are authorized.

MWR LEISURE TRAVEL: Authorized Patrons include: All members of the United States Reserve Components and their Family Members with a valid ID card; currently employed and retired APF, NAF, and DoD and Coast Guard civilians; DoD contract employees working full time on the installation; guests when accompanied by authorized patrons; former Prisoners of War (POWs), and spouses of current POWs or Service members missing in action (MIA) and their Family Members; and Non-DoD Federal employees working on the installation.

OUTDOOR RECREATION: Authorized Patrons include: All members of the United States Reserve Components and their Family Members with a valid ID card; currently employed and retired APF, NAF, and retired DoD and Coast Guard civilians; DoD contract employees working full time on the installation; guests when accompanied by authorized patrons; former Prisoners of War (POWs), and spouses of current POWs or Service members missing in action (MIA) and their Family Members; non-DoD Federal employees working on the installation. Fort Rucker Lake Tholocco areas and facilities will remain open to members of the public.

PHYSICAL FITNESS CENTERS: Authorized Patrons include: All Active Duty Military and their family members with a valid ID card. All members of the United States Reserve Components and their Family Members with a valid ID card are authorized. Currently employed and retired APF, NAF and DoD and Coast Guard civilians and Family members residing in the sponsor's household are authorized. DoD contract employees working full time on the installation are authorized, except during PT hours (0500-0715 Mon-Fri), on a space available basis. Former Prisoners of War (POW's), and spouses of current POWs or service members missing in action (MIA) and their Family Members are authorized. Non-DoD Federal employees working on the installation are authorized. Guest Policy: Active Duty/Retired military and their Family members only may sponsor guests at the facility. Guests must be accompanied by the sponsor.

RIDING STABLES: All members of the United States Reserve Components and their Family Members with a valid ID card are authorized. Currently employed and retired APF, NAF, and DoD and Coast Guard civilians are authorized DoD contract employees working full time on the installation are authorized. Community area residents with no military affiliation may participate in Riding Stables activities. Participation will be IAW Equestrian Center operational procedures for nonmilitary patrons, and on a space availability basis. Former Prisoners of War (POWs), and spouses of current POWs or Service members missing in action (MIA) and their Family Members are authorized. Non-DoD Federal employees working on the installation are authorized.

SKILL DEVELOPMENT ACTIVITIES (AUTO, ARTS & CRAFTS): Authorized Patrons include: All members of the United States Reserve Components and their Family Members with a valid ID card; Currently employed and retired APF, NAF, and DoD and Coast Guard civilians; DoD contract employees working full time on the installation; guests when accompanied by authorized patrons, any; any guests must stay with authorized patron throughout visit; former Prisoners of War (POWs), and spouses of current POWs or Service members missing in action (MIA) and their Family Members; and non-DoD Federal employees working on the installation.

FUNDRAISER REQUESTS

Fundraiser Form Instructions (Forms are available from the MWR NAF Support Management Division or online at rucker.armymwr.com): The request must be completed and submitted to DFMWR 30 DAYS PRIOR to the fundraising event. If submitted less than 30 days prior, the event MAY NOT BE APPROVED. Forms should be returned to MWR Support Services Division, Bldg. 5700 Room 310.

TO COMPLETE THE FORM:

- 1 Please provide your unit information, soldier family readiness group information, or private organization name.
- 2 What kind of event are you trying to hold? i.e. car wash, cookie sales, popcorn sales, donation giveaway, etc. NOTE: If you are having a donation giveaway, please annotate what the item is that will be given away on this same line. Example (Item: Xbox).
- 3 Please provide the date and time of your event. The application may not contain dates for multiple events. However, the application can have multiple dates for the same event. Example of compliant is a seasonal event held over a range of days, i.e. gift wrapping (December 12-14). Example of non-compliant is scheduling separate car washes on one application (May 15, June 20, etc.).

- 4 Where do you plan on having this event? Are you having it at multiple sites? List the locations where you plan to raise your funds here. It is your responsibility to coordinate approval with the manager of a facility prior to submitting your request. Please obtain the printed name, signature, and phone number from the locations' management/commander on the supplemental lines provided. Please attach additional approvals on a separate sheet of paper.
- 5 Please provide a fee or donation amount that your organization will be accepting during the event.
- 6 If your event will require military or logistical support, please attach a separate page explaining your intent and the support you would like to request.

If an Unit Informal Fund or SFRG you must provide a signed copy of your informal fund SOP. SFRGs require a signature from the battalion level or equivalent prior to being submitted.
